

Much of your student's science class will be taught through LEARN. Your student will be able to access class assignments, homework, the textbook, course announcements, and flipcharts and Power Points used in class from anywhere they have internet access. This allows them to keep up with work, even when absent, and to correspond with me about any issues they may be having with homework. I encourage you to check your child's LEARN account regularly to stay up to date on their progress in class.



Students are expected to obtain any missing assignments from the files kept in class or by checking the LEARN calendar when they are absent.



In our class, students will be graded on a point system. Each assignment is given a point total and the grade is calculated from that. All points from the various assignments are added together in order to determine a final grade.

Ex. An assignment is worth 75 points means--

A= 68-75 points; B= 60-67 points; C= 53-59 points; D= 45-52 points; F= 44 points and below
